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Chesapeake Bay Governor's School Places Second in Virginia's 15th Annual Regional Ocean Science Bowl

Students from all three campuses of the Chesapeake Bay Governor's School -- Bowling Green, Glenns and Warsaw -- competed in the in the Annual Blue Crab Bowl, a day-long marine science academic tournament held at Old Dominion University (ODU) in Norfolk on March 3.

The team from the Glenns Campus took Second Place honors. Coached by science teacher Sara Chaves Beam, the CBGS-Glenns Campus Team included: Team Captain Emma Hepworth (senior, Gloucester High); and team members Alexys Gray (junior, New Kent High); Grayson Johnson (senior, Middlesex High School); Hans Saunders (junior, Mathews High); and Marissa Voight (junior, King & Queen High). The team received a Blue Crab Bowl Trophy and other prizes in recognition of their success.

Also participating from the Chesapeake Bay Governor's School was a team from the **Bowling** Green Campus. Coached by science teacher Dr. Eric Lund, this team included Team Captain Taylor Coxon, with team members Tahir Ahmad; Nathan Ball, Carlos Ortiz and Trevor Penkwitz.

The third Chesapeake Bay Governor's School team was from the Warsaw Campus. Science teachers Bethany Smith and Jim Beam coached Team Captain Bethany Pritchard and team members Jeremiah Brown, Karsten Coates, Meghan Frere, and Jennie Latane.

This year's First Place team, Bishop Sullivan Catholic High School Team A from Virginia Beach, will compete in the National Ocean Science Bowl Competition, April 19-22, in Baltimore, Maryland. Other top placing teams were Seton School (Manassas) in Third Place and Grafton High School (Yorktown) in Fourth Place.

A total of sixteen teams competed in this year's tournament, the 15th Annual Blue Crab Bowl. Students who participate prepare through class work and extracurricular study with their science teachers, who serve as coaches. Students explore marine science topics, practice thinking on their feet, and develop team and analytical skills for the competitive quiz bowl setting. During Saturday's event, the competition started with a field of 16 teams, with four emerging as top contenders by late afternoon.

The Blue Crab Bowl is Virginia's regional competition of the National Ocean Sciences Bowl and one of the 15 founding competitions. The Blue Crab Bowl aims to encourage students' understanding and awareness of ocean sciences, including oceanography, geology, biology, maritime history, and marine policy. The Blue Crab Bowl is the result cooperative effort between the Virginia Institute of Marine Sciences and the Department of Ocean, Earth, and Atmospheric Sciences at Old Dominion University. More than 70 faculty, graduate students, research and support staff volunteer their time to officiate and manage the event.

This year's Blue Crab Bowl was made possible by the sponsorship of national, regional, and local sponsors.
